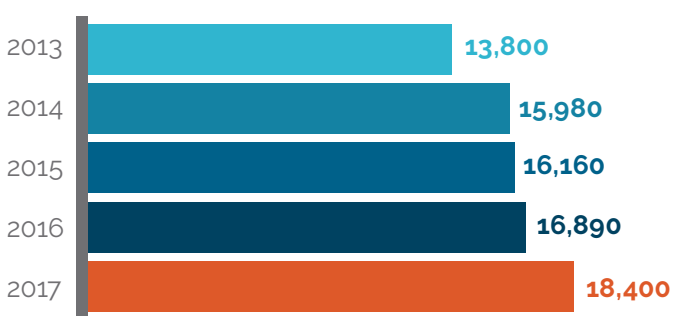


Workplace Violence Climbs¹

Incidents of violence in the private sector



Nearly 2 million

American workers report having been affected by workplace violence every year.²



1 in 7 employees

feels unsafe at work.³



In 2018, 820 people died as a result of workplace violence.

(From 2014 to 2018, the rate of occupational injuries and illnesses resulting from violence and other injuries increased from 6.8 cases per 10,000 full-time workers in 2014 to 7.3 cases in 2018.)⁴

The Economic Impact of Workplace Violence



On average, 500,000 employees miss **1,175,100 workdays** each year due to workplace violence, resulting in more than **\$55 million in lost wages.**⁶

What Should Organizations Do?

- Identify workplace risk and its factors.
- Use security controls.
- Foster culture of preparedness.
- Develop a workplace violence prevention program.
- Provide regular workplace violence prevention training and exercises.
- Implement an incident management system for prompt communication.
